What is Fit for Cooperation?

The Interreg Italy-Austria project Fit for Cooperation – Cross Border Obstacles (Fit4Co CBO) aims to help public administrations and municipalities in the Euregio Tyrol–South Tyrol–Trentino and in the Euregio Senza Confini to get fit for cross-border cooperation. It does so by developing initiatives that start with local people. Local administrations, municipalities, regional managers, social partners: anyone with an idea gets support through coaching, workshops and hands-on expertise in the Euregio Tyrol–South Tyrol–Trentino or through direct funding to public administrations to support them in overcoming cross-border obstacles in the Euregio Senza Confini.

As part of the Interreg project Fit4Co CBO, 25 project tandems and more than 300 participants have developed project ideas and initiated first steps.

The added value of this bottom-up approach for the EUSALP-area and concrete project outcomes will be presented during a workshop on 26 November 2025 at the EUSALP Annual Forum in Innsbruck (Austria).

The Interreg project Fit4Co CBO is co-funded by the European Union as part of the Interreg VI-A Italy—Austria 2021-2027 programme.

What is EUSALP?

The EU Strategy for the Alpine Region (EUSALP) brings together seven countries and 48 regions to tackle shared challenges in the Alpine area through transnational cooperation and sustainable development.

It focuses on innovation, connectivity, environmental protection, and strengthening institutional capacities across borders.

Under the Austrian-Liechtenstein Co-Presidency in 2025, EUSALP emphasizes practical solutions for climate resilience, green mobility, and youth engagement in Alpine governance.

Austria and Liechtenstein are promoting a hands-on approach by supporting pilot projects and fostering dialogue between regional stakeholders.

The outcomes of this presidency will be showcased during key events such as the Annual Forum and thematic workshops, highlighting the Alpine region's role in shaping Europe's future.
